Success vs. Access

- Accommodations under the ADA and Section 504 provide equal access to all University programs, services, and activities
- Serve to level the playing field for students with disabilities
- Should not provide an advantage
- Do not guarantee success

Registration Process with the Goldman Center

- 1. Request accommodations by completing our online application form and submitting supporting documentation.
- 2. Follow the steps provided in an email from goldman@tulane.edu sent to the student's Tulane email to schedule an Access Meeting.
- 3. Student attends the Access Meeting to discuss the request(s) with one of our staff members as part of our interactive process for determining accommodations.

^{*} Note: this process can take time (up to several weeks depending on the time of the year).

Priority Deadline is:

- January 16th for current students
- February 14th for Spring Scholars and Transfer Students

Shipping to Campus

- Detailed Information will be coming this week by USPS mail and to the student's Tulane email.
- Every student will receive a mail code and shipping address to use while living on campus.
- In-Room pre-delivery for Move In program
- Ship up to 6 packages to be placed in room prior to your arrival
- Additional packages will be charged \$10/package
- Packages for must arrive at Tulane between December 9-December 31
- Ship From Home, Tulane Shipping Portal--Save on FedEx Ground Retail pricing by using this easy online shipping option. https://mailservices.tulane.edu/students/2-ship
- If you ship from online shopping services, always use your student's full Tulane address and mail code number (not their residence hall name and room number).
- Beware of same day delivery services from Wal-Mart and other retailers because these services do not deliver to proper locations on campus.
- Please review our **prohibited items list** of items which cannot be shipped to Tulane:

- Items received after December 31 will be available to pick up from the Tulane Mail Center or from parcel lockers in other campus locations. Students will receive an email with instructions for every package received.

Residence Hall Move-In Information

Housing and Residence Life (HRL) will assign and email your student's Move-In date and arrival time slot by mid-December.

Wednesday, January 7, 2026 – Move-In Day

HRL will assign a specific 30-minute arrival time slot between 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. to arrive on campus, check-in, and begin moving into their residence hall room.

In January, your student will also receive additional information outlining specific instructions for your move-in day, as well as general information about living on campus. Staff volunteers with golf carts will be available to help you transport items to your student's residence hall.

• When planning your travel to New Orleans, keep in mind that students have required activities after Move-In for Orientation and/or Recruitment. If you wish to spend time together as a family in New Orleans, plan to do that before your student's Move-In Day.
