



Role of Academic Advising

- Course selection
- Academic planning
- Monitor degree requirements and academic progress
- Major, minor, interdisciplinary and specialized study options and exploration
- Navigating changes between majors or schools
- Understand university policies and procedures
- Transfer credit review and approval assistance
- Withdrawal and leave of absence
- Pre-professional planning and preparation



Registration Overview



- Schedule appointment using link in recent email sent through Admission OR on our incoming student website.
- Advisor will meet with student **one-on-one** using Zoom link sent to Tulane email 24 hours prior to appointment.
- Parents should refrain from joining their student for these appointments.
- Student to prepare for meeting by completing:
 - Advising & Registration Module in Canvas
 - Registration Worksheet
 - Foreign Language Placement (if necessary)
 - Building a practice planner on schedule
 - Logging into Schedule of Classes



June Appointments

- Booking advising appointments
- Pre-registration & Course Availability
- Registration open for day of appointment
- First year schedules need to have:
 - First Year Seminar: TIDES
 - Sequential classes required for major
 - 15-18 credits (4-5 classes)
- July 1, Registration re-opens


Core Curriculum & Major Exploration



- Core Curriculum is flexible & most interests will cover something in the core.
- Many majors at Tulane are flexible & allow for multiple pursuits.
- We will start with most structured major interests and build from there.
- Goal is to register in 15-17 credits & comfort using our scheduling system
- There is time to adjust schedule on July 1st through first week of classes.
- Registration open until end of day of appointment.

✓ Check resources for credit equivalencies (AP/IB/A-Levels)

✓ Send all credits from all years to Tulane

Art History	4 or 5	3 credit hours (ARHS 1010)
Art Studio: Drawing	4 or 5	3 credit hours (ARST 1101) Students may consult with Art Department to be considered for ARST 2101 credit
Art Studio: 2D Design	4 or 5	3 credit hours (ARST 1101) Students may consult with Art Department to be considered for ARST 2101 credit
Art Studio: 3D Design	4 or 5	3 credit hours (ARST 1490)

✓ Submit dual enrollment or pre-Tulane credits to our transfer credit specialist

How you can support your student



- Help your student reflect on what classes they will enjoy and what they will excel in.
- Help student research majors/minors prior to appointments.
- Have conversations with your student about academic plans that may require additional time or expense. (e.g. summer school ideas, study abroad, etc.)
- Remind your students to be patient & flexible.
- Manage their expectations & encourage them to seek help from advisors when they feel stuck
