- > Students with newly identified support needs



REQUESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

- 1. Complete an application (accessibility.tulane.edu).
- 2. Submit documentation (reference our website for more specific guidance).
- 3. Schedule a meeting with a member of the Goldman Center staff.
- 4. Meet with a member of the Goldman Center staff to further discuss your request and possible options for accommodation.
- 5. Students will receive an email at their Tulane address confirming their approved accommodations and directions for next steps.

All requests are completed on an individualized basis, which may affect:

- Documentation requirements
- Timeline
- Outcome
