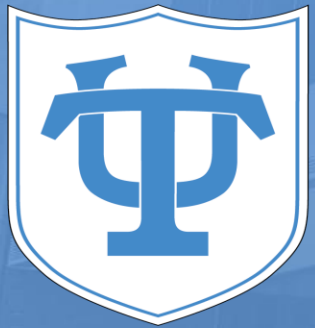

 - Foster relationships with faculty members
 - Explore and prepare for future academic or professional pursuits
 - Enhance critical and analytical thinking skills
 - Collaborate and work effectively as part of a team
 - Develop translatable problem solving and communication skills

Summer Research Program

- For students with a faculty mentor in mind
- Staying on Tulane campus over the summer
- \$2,000 per student, \$1,000 per faculty member
- Apply by mid-March
- For all types of research experiences
- Monthly guided didactic sessions



ASPIRE Research Buddy Program

- For students interested in a career in medicine
- Opportunity to participate in clinical research
- Staying on Tulane campus over the summer
- Fully covered room and board
- Apply by mid-March
- Bimonthly guided didactic sessions
- Guest speakers from across the medical field
