- Summer storage for the summers <u>after</u> the first, sophomore, and junior year is explained every year in the <u>Spring Move-Out</u> section of the Housing & Residence Life website. Details are updated annually around mid-spring semester.
- The **2024 Reading Project** book selection for the Class of 2028 is *Platonic: How The Science of Attachment Can Help You Make—and Keep—Friends* by Dr. Marisa G Franco. Students are required to read the book over the summer and participate in a faculty-led group discussion on Friday, August 16, 2024, during their Hullabaloo Hello (orientation) experience. <u>https://firstyear.tulane.edu/reading-project</u>.
- Health Insurance Action Process begins starting June 20, 2024 After the student enrolls in classes, they should monitor their Tulane email for health insurance requirements and details. They must either enroll in the Tulane-sponsored Student Health Insurance Plan (T-SHIP) or complete the waiver process to provide proof that their family's insurance meets the requirements so they can opt out of T-SHIP before they arrive to campus or by the posted August 15, 2024, whichever is earliest.
